DIAGNOSTIC QUESTIONS

A visit to the doctor due to an ailment usually begins with questions...

How did this start? How long has it persisted? Doctors probe our recent past to construct a diagnosis. Then they may prescribe medicine, surgery, or lifestyle changes (like giving up your beloved Twinkies)hoping to bring an end to the malady.

Many churches in the West show signs of ailing. Loss of appetite for the Word can indicate deeper problems (1 Pet 2:1-3). Is spiritual exercise expended after godliness (1 Tim 4:7-8) or for superficial things? And what about our energy level? Are we living in the "exceeding greatness of His power" (Eph 1:19)?

Recently I had the privilege of speaking about the church to a roomful of young disciples, students at the university nearby. It was 6:30 a.m. and they were eager to learn. As I drew my talk to its conclusion, I posed five questions to help them diagnose the heart of Christ's desire for His beloved church:

1. Should the church be Christ-oriented or people-oriented? It's true that those who follow Christ will care deeply about people, both saved and those needing to be saved. But the church's orientation is to gather to Christ: to live Christ (Phil 1:21), to know Christ (1 Cor 2:2), to preach Christ (1 Cor 1:23), and to serve Christ (Col 3:24) in such a way as to glorify Christ (Eph 3:21)—revealing God's beautiful character for all who live in our communities to see.

- 2. Should the church be lifestyle-based or eventbased? Fulfilling my responsibility by "going to church" for an hour is unknown in Scripture. We are the church and, although we gather with others for worship and encouragement, we continue to live out church life at all times. Everything becomes holy service. The kitchen table is an altar, the family room a sanctuary, our work clothes the holy vestments of a priest (see Zech 14:20).
- 3. Should its structure and function be determined by the Word of God or man's traditions? The answer should go without saying. Not that we might do some things in a certain way not prescribed in Scripture, but that God's way must always take precedence over human opinion. We must especially beware of "teaching as doctrines the commandments of men" (Mt 15:9). Remember: the Lord knows best! And it's always the right time to do the right thing.
- 4. Should the main objective be spiritual growth or numerical growth? Again, it's the Lord's desire that we reach "every creature." But focusing primarily on numerical growth can lead to compromise, leaving churches "a mile wide and an inch deep." The Lord linked evangelism with discipleship for a very good reason, and we should too.
- 5. Should our gathering be more like a rescue mission or a country club? If our unspoken objective is to be comfortable more than comforters, evangelicals rather than evangelists, and self-satisfied more than Christ-occupied, we will settle down into spiritual mediocrity and stale ineffectiveness. Note the warning—and encouragement—of 1 Corinthians 3:9-17. What an honor to be workers together with Christ.







Here's an encouraging note sent to us from Mark commenting on this experience: "Several years ago, the 'Good News on the Move' team came to Albany Gospel Chapel. The young men on this team were being discipled in the field of the world. They went door to door giving the gospel wherever they went. The consciences of the older brethren were pricked! A few of us began to meet before work on Wednesday mornings to pray. It was decided that we would reach out to our community with the gospel.

To begin with, we organized by mapping out areas we would visit. Then we ordered gospel resources (including a custom-made gospel DVD from Uplook) to place in door knob hangers. We met to pray, set basic guidelines, and practice our introductions when the door opened.



Then we stepped out on faith...and we were excited! We were blessed! We came to the realization that knocking on a door and giving the gospel was not that difficult.

Albany Gospel Chapel has sent out, supported, and prayed for missionaries and ministries far and near over the years. From my perspective though, it was when we corporately went out together that the assembly became complete. In laboring together, we began sharing, confessing, and praying with one another. We were growing in faith, enabling us to teach and demonstrate to others firsthand how to share the gospel.

As a result, there was greater unity and love within our assembly. This experience has empowered us in practical and purposeful ways to witness for Christ throughout our day, wherever we are, and in whatever we are doing. Saved sinners sharing the Savior with lost sinners! Let us not neglect the Great Commission! And let us start where we are, for our mission field is where we live!

Do we want to RADIATE CHRIST to a dark and dying world?

Like Ezra, let us "set our hearts to study the law of the LORD and to practice it, and to teach His statutes and ordinances" (Ezr 7:10). The Word of God, properly studied, implemented, and shared, is essential to accomplishing His work.

Next, let us "**set our mind** on the things above, not on the things that are on earth" (Col 3:2). There's lots to discourage us in this world. But believers have the privilege of looking up and letting the goodness of glory sweeten our lives and testimonies here below.

Above all, let us "**set our eyes on Jesus**, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Heb 12:2). No matter what the trial, focusing on His beauty and perfect example will sustain us and help us to walk in His steps.

Let us cultivate the moment-by-moment practice of setting our hearts on the Word, our minds on things above, and our eyes on Jesus. — **Jamie Martin**
