

"Simultaneously with the death of Christ on Calvary came this divine rending of the veil of the Temple. So the way was opened—not to a mercy-seat and an ark, for no ark existed in Herod's Temple. All trace of the Ark had been lost hundreds of years earlier at the time when Solomon's Temple was destroyed. The death of Christ did not open the way to an Ark, but to God Himself. Types are now fading away as realities shed forth their wonderful light. Christ dies to turn shadows into substance." —C.W. Slemming (Made According to Pattern, p. 131)

"It was not the beauty of the veil that made entrance possible just as it was not the beauty of Christ's earthly life that makes salvation possible. There had to be the sprinkling of the atoning blood in the Old Testament times, which pointed forward to the necessity of the Lord Jesus Christ's shedding His blood on the cross. No one is saved from condemnation by endeavoring to imitate the life of Christ or by attempting to keep the Law.
